"Arc gave me a roof over my head and if it wasn't for them I could have been anywhere"



Chris became homeless just over a year ago and found himself sleeping rough in Bridgwater. After a couple of weeks of sleeping rough Chris was offered sheltered accommodation with Arc. His story not only demonstrates his own strength and resolve during austerity, but also proves that by integrating armed forces specialist roles within mainstream services, help and support can be accessed. Having previously served as a soldier in the British Army Chris' veteran status was identified and he was subsequently offered a room in Arc's Veteran accommodation service, 'Victory House'.

"I found myself homeless after a bad relationship and went to the British Legion Hub in Bridgwater who put me in contact with Arc." Suffering with his mental health and self-esteem, Victory House offered solace and support amongst fellow veterans. It would eventually be Chris' desire for improved resilience and independence that would prove to be the catalyst to moving on.

Chris engaged well with support staff, and it wasn't long before he developed the confidence to start working towards bettering his life. "When I got to Victory House, there's two ways you can go - you can become dependant on staying in your room or you can make yourself a better life and that's what I decided to do." Arc were able to assist Chris in getting a diagnosis of complex Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder and from here, he accessed Arc's counselling service.

Chris used Arc's services for just under a year, and within the first six months had completed ten educational courses. He continued to engage well with external agencies, as well as finding time to volunteer at one of the local charity shops. "Getting out of the house kept me going, and I'd work seven days a week sometimes, I felt like I was worth something and it was nice meeting new people. I just wanted to make something of myself and felt like it was my chance."

One of the many courses Chris completed was the "Tenant Ready Scheme" or "TRS" which is hosted locally by the YMCA. This course is designed to prepare individuals for the responsibilities of being a housing tenant. After searching for his own home, Chris was offered his own flat.

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Having moved on from Arc, Chris now volunteers with Ark at Egwood, another fantastic charity that we're partnered with for our armed forces project. Chris aspires to eventually work as a veteran's peer support worker within the NHS. He has started a growing Facebook support group and breakfast club, which can be found by searching "Veterans Chat and Support Group - Chard and Surrounding Areas. Keep up the amazing work, Chris!

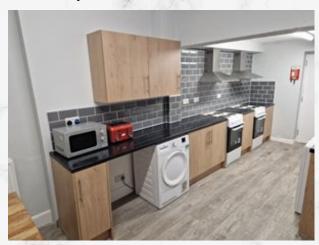
